

CORIN CONTINUES TO SUPPORT MOTEC'S ORTHOPAEDIC TRAUMA WORK IN GHANA

Motec's orthopaedic trauma work in the target hospitals is often punctuated by the frustrations of power failure and broken down power tools. Our organisation has been guiding the local hospitals to find long lasting solutions to the problem.

In the meantime, Motec launched an appeal for help with power tools. Corin UK has donated re-chargeable power tools worth thousands of pounds to Motec for use during working visits to Ghana. Mr Robert Welsh donated the equipment on behalf of the Company in February. Mr Welsh said: 'We are prepared to support your efforts to bring better care and improvements in orthopaedic trauma care in Ghana. One area that we will help collaborate is a hospital based small orthopaedic plate and screw manufacturing base in Ghana given our experiences elsewhere in the developing world.' In response, Mr Ofori-Atta recalled the other instances that Corin had rescued Motec. He expressed his profound gratitude to the Managing Director and Corin UK for their contributions to humanity through the support of charitable work in Africa by Motec. The equipment will be put to use by Motec for the first time in the target hospitals in Ghana in June of 2008.
