

NKAWKAW HIV PROJECT RECEIVES SUPPORT FROM RAJAH

In October 2009, a young high school student Asif Rajah from St Albans City was in Ghana with Motec Life –UK for his work experience. He chose to work with the Nkawkaw Holy Family Hospital public health HIV/AIDS support team. From his experiences with the plight of the patients, he pledged to work hard upon return to UK.
